#### PROJECT AIMS & METHODS:

plore the narratives represented in Montgomery's public spaces of commemoration and heritage by analysing their visual, textual and spatial elements.

What narratives around race are present? Whose perspectives are dominant? How do these stories differ to the EJI's work? What is highlighted, and what or who is made invisible?

Investigate how space is used to uphold or challenge systemic racism through fieldwork, and semistructured interviews with local residents.

How is the landscape of Montgomery shaped physically and symbolically by racial oppression? How does its spaces work to reproduce racial inequality?

More broadly, look at the question of what role monuments and museums can play in social justice movements..
