Moreover, he has supported the EC in the design, implementation and assessment of 1) eco-design and energy labelling regulations for energy related products and 2) the EU

Directive on Energy Efficiency. At the JRC, he also invented an interdisciplinary research line combining complex systems and social practices perspectives that has involved acknowledged scholars working in the areas of energy transition and energy sustainability.

His thinking on complexity is mainly informed by studies and publications on Ivan Illich, Bruno Latour's works on actor network theory, Theodore Schatzki's practices theory, and Giorgio Agamben's studies and ideas on potentiality, indifference and the anthropological machine. His articles on Ivan Illich have been published in the International Journal of Illich Studies and in the periodical *Conspiratio* (https://thinkingafterivanillich.net/conspiratio/).

Nicola has also worked as a researcher for Milano Politecnico in Italy. During the ten years spent at this university, he mainly managed international research projects focusing on design, implementation, monitoring and evaluation of energy end-use efficiency policies implemented by EU member states to comply with the EU Energy Service Directive, now replaced by the EU Energy Efficiency Directive.

Nicola has a PhD from the Universitá di Milano and a Masters degree from the Universitá di Pisa (both in elementary particle physics).

Michael Lewis is Senior Lecturer in Philosophy at the University of Newcastle upon Tyne and General Editor of the Journal of Italian Philosophy.
