

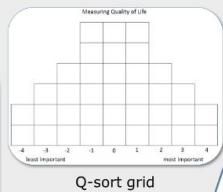
Measuring Quality of Life

We wanted to know if the World Health Organisation's Quality of Life questionnaire (the WHOQoL-BREF) accurately measures Quality of Life. This questionnaire asks about 4 aspects of life: Physical, Psychological, Social, and Environmental.

To do this we carried out 4 focus groups with autistic people, in the North East of England.

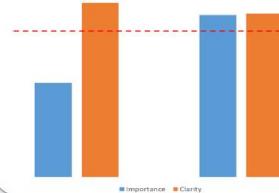
We asked each group to prioritise the questions using a 'Q-sort' and to tell us the pro's and con's about the questions.

I'd never met any autistic people before. I've thought, actually it's been really nice to talk with someone that actually understands what I'm saying



We used a survey to ask people how important and clear the new questions were; revising questions based on the feedback we received.

Questions that were not rated important or clear enough (the red line on the graph) were excluded. Two of the 11 questions were eliminated.

Physical
... includes if pain affects your life, how happy you are with your sleep, if medication affects your life, and if you are happy with your ability to work - amongst others



Psychological
... includes a meaningful life, enjoying life, ability to concentrate, and personal identity - amongst others



Environmental
... includes your satisfaction with transport or access to health services, how safe you feel, and if you have enough money for your needs



Social
... includes how satisfied you are with your friends, personal relationships, and your sex life



Testing

Item creation

I interpreted that one, "how able are you to get around?" as more a physical thing about walking... or does it mean transport?
Different interpretation

My concentration can go off on many things. For example loud music and I get distracted that way, or loud noises and I may just tend to shut my ears off.
Quote about sensory issues

We looked at what people had said from each discussion group to see what was good, and not so good, about the questions.

Some questions were interpreted differently and there were some 'missing' areas (such as sensory issues) - see quotes above.

We identified key *themes* from what people said in the discussion group.

Some of the themes were about friendship, finances, and the knowledge other people in society have about autism.

We used these themes to create 11 Quality of Life questions that can be used with the WHOQoL-BREF.
