






Building Early Sentences Therapy









Homework guide

These homework packs have been designed to support the language skills your child is learning during the BEST sessions by giving them **extra listening opportunities in a different setting**. There is one booklet for each of the 16 BEST sessions containing the same sentences used in the session. Try to spend **5-10 minutes each day** (or as often as you can!) going through the booklets with your child. You

"Let's look at some pictures together!"

(or as often as you can!) going through the booklets with your child. You can scan the QR code at the bottom for a video showing what to do and follow the tips below. Make sure your child's teacher gives you a new homework booklet after each BEST session.

- Point to each picture in turn and leave a short gap to see if your child wants to describe the picture, but don't ask them to describe it.
- If your child describes the picture but misses out a word or uses an incorrect word don't correct it, say the correct sentence in full after your child has spoken. The most important thing is that your child hears the full sentence.

Child: "Girl sitting" Adult: "Yes! The girl is sitting."

- If your child says nothing **don't prompt them**, just say the full sentence.
- It is important that you do not ask your child to repeat the sentence after you have spoken.
- Your child does not have to be looking at you or at the pictures, as long as they can hear the sentence.














Set C—Eating









