Communicating cultural heritage through festivals

The impact of cultural heritage festivals on local and regional development

August 17, 2017, at Cesis New Castle, the town of Cesis

Seminar language: Latvian, individual interpretation to English if necessary

Participants: policy makers on local, regional and national level; representatives of cultural organisations and other stakeholders

The seminar with policy makers and stakeholders on impact of heritage festivals on local and regional development takes place in the framework of the project "Critical Heritages: performing and representing identities in Europe", organised by the consortium of 12 European partners with Latvian Academy of Culture and project leaders Newcastle University among them. The seminar is a follow-up on the workshop with stakeholders on tourism potential of heritage festivals, held on March 20, 2017 organised by the Heriot Watt University in Edinburgh.

The impact of culture on local and regional development can be observed on individual level (increasing social and cultural capital, positive impact on participation in culture, developing stronger communities and their identities, improving quality of life for local inhabitants etc.) and on regional and local development level (impact on economic performance, job creation, place branding etc.). There are different instruments for intensifying these impacts. Particularly we are interested to look at the role of heritage festivals on local and regional development.

The main aim of the seminar is twofold. One the one hand, we would like to identify diverse impacts heritage festivals have on local and regional development and to understand the significance of each of them. On the other hand, we would like to look at different policy instruments that could enhance the impact of heritage festivals and their role in regional and local development. Cases of different festivals will be presented during the seminar as well.
