Please consider **how you believe the student feels about their self and their own learning**. This questionnaire is about what the teacher *thinks* the **child's belief about their self** is, *not* about what the teacher knows the child does or does not do. This is not a test and there are no right answers – we are seeking your beliefs about your students.

Please read each sentence and decide your answer in relation to the student you have identified above. There are 5 possible answers for each question – 'True', 'False' and 3 answers in between. The numbers 1 to 5 are next to each sentence, for each of the answers. The answers are written at the top of the page, above the numbers. Choose your answer to a sentence and circle the number of the answer you choose.

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EXAMPLES:

a. *This student likes to read comic books*

(Circling the number 5 means that the teacher believes the student really likes to read comic books)

b. *This student believes that they are neat and tidy*

(Circling the number 3 means that the teacher believes the student thinks that they are not very neat, but not very messy either)

c. *This student likes to watch T.V*

(Circling the number 2 means that the teacher believes the student does not like to watch T.V very much)
