

Ask your child to hold a net in each hand – encourage him/her to pick these up straight from the table with his/her hands. If he/she struggles, he/she can pick up with the dominant hand and pass to the helper hand.



Ask your child to try to catch about the same number of butterflies in each net and to reach up high to catch them.

When they have all been caught, ask your child to empty the butterflies onto the table, by turning over his/her hands.



Your child can now choose one net.



Holding the net in one hand, your child should use the other hand to pick up the butterflies which match the colour of the net and put them in that net (i.e. red butterflies in red net etc.). Continue sorting the butterflies using the other nets.



At the end, ask your child to put all of the butterflies back into the plastic bag, holding the bag in one hand and picking up the butterflies with the other.
