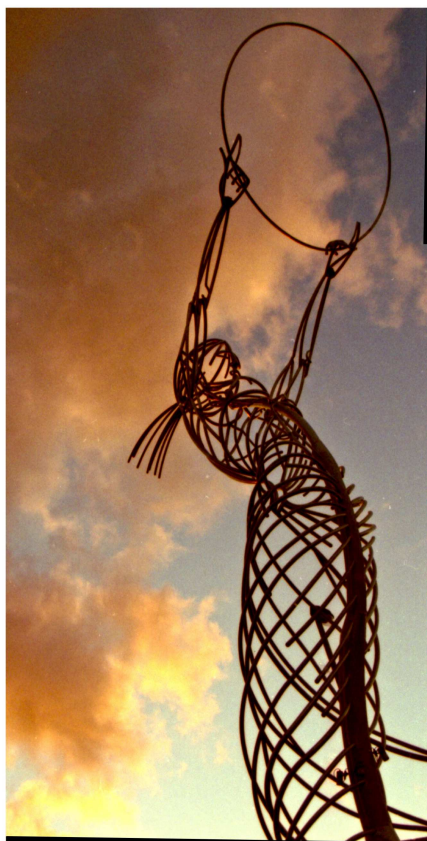

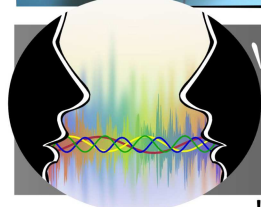
# Stories of Migration The Young Irishlanders

It also launches the "From Home to Here" exhibition at the Linen Hall, which takes place between October 1st and 31st and explores 'Belonging', 'Exile' and 'Identity'.
