Data collection is ongoing. The current phase of data collection is gathering information about the work the Clinical Dementia Leads are doing.

Observations and interviews with the Clinical Dementia Leads, practice staff and other professionals, people living with dementia and their families will be ongoing until Spring 2023.

We are delighted to announce that our funders, The Alzheimer's Society, have given us a further extension to the PriDem project. PriDem will now run until September 2023. This will give us more time to write up our findings and share widely.
