PriDem: From Newcastle...for the world



In March our project lead, Louise Robinson, was invited to speak at the World Dementia Council, a collaboration between global dementia leaders, policymakers and advocates who work together to improve the prospects for people living with dementia. Louise presented an overview of PriDem and was also part of a discussion on current priorities for dementia where she emphasised the need for equality in post-diagnostic support for families across the UK, and the world.

Louise has also recently submitted examples of how the new PriDem intervention could improve support in practice to be included in two international reports; Alzheimer's Disease International From Plan to Impact 2022 and the World Alzheimer's Report 2022.
