Data collection for workstream 4 is complete! This phase of data collection was aimed at gathering information about the work the Clinical Dementia Leads have completed with their GP practices, people living with dementia, and their carers. The analysis of this data is well under way! Our statistician team at University College London (UCL) and Nottingham University are currently analysing the data we collected from questionnaires completed by people living with dementia, and their carers. The supplementary interview data is being analysed for key themes by UCL and our team in Newcastle.

- *DemRisk* one of our current projects with the University of Nottingham is exploring people's understanding of dementia and dementia-associated risks in underrepresented groups (i.e., people from lower socioeconomic backgrounds or ethnic minority groups). We have held a number of local events in the community to discuss these topics and hope to present our findings in the near future. Watch this space!
