

Can your centre help us recruit 50 patients by the end of September 2012?

Recruitment to the trial will pause on **30th September 2012** and we hope to have recruited **200 patients** by this date. Please continue to screen for potential patients for the trial and help us reach this target.

We would like to encourage all centres who have registered their interest in the trial to continue to complete the regulatory process.



Now that we have recruited 150 patients we will be submitting our next report to the Data Monitoring Committee. Please can all registered centres send us any outstanding data as soon as possible.

As you can see from the graph above 150 patients have been randomised and there are 55 registered centres in the trial. We have 6 UK centres, 18 in Europe and 31 from the rest of the world. So far 139 centres have registered their interest in participating in the trial.

Inclusion Criteria

- Adults aged 14 or over.
- Evidence of 1 or 2 TICHs or contusions with a confluent volume of attenuation significantly raised above that of the background white and grey matter that has a total volume greater than 10mls (calculated by width x height x length /2 in cm).
- Within 48 hours of head injury.
- Clinical equipoise: only patients for whom the responsible neurosurgeon is uncertain about the benefits of either treatment are eligible.

Exclusion Criteria

- A significant surface haematoma (EDH or SDH) requiring surgery.
- Three or more separate haematomas fulfilling inclusion criteria.
- If surgery cannot be performed within 12 hours of randomisation.
- If the haemorrhage/ contusion is located in the cerebellum.
- Severe pre-existing physical or mental disability or severe co-morbidity which would lead to a poor outcome even if the patient made a full recovery from the head injury.
- Permanent residence outside a study country preventing follow up.
- Patient and/or relative has a strong preference for one treatment modality.
